

Central Australia

Join the fun at a variety of quirky festivals throughout the year in celebration of the town's heritage. Alice Springs is a true outback experience made easy with modern conveniences.

It may be remote, but Alice Springs is surrounded by beauty. The MacDonnell Ranges are a major drawcard and an easy drive from Alice Springs. By day, unlock the unique character of the West MacDonnell's chasms and gorges. Take a dip in one of the swimming holes or lace up the walking shoes for a trek among the gorges. By night, the ranges take on a red glow in the evening light.

Top End

It's a nature lover's paradise in the Top End. Kakadu National Park, Litchfield National Park, Katherine Gorge and Arnhem Land – they're all in the Top End and jam-packed with stunning waterfalls and lush landscapes. 




Arnhem Land is a place like no other. Time stands still and ancient culture lives on. The Aboriginal-owned 91,000 square kilometre region is one of the last great unspoilt areas in the world. 














1. Arnhem Land

Spend a day at Litchfield National Park and unwind in the tranquil settings of nature. Enjoy monsoon rainforests, calming waterfalls and notable historic ruins. Take a dip in the waterholes Wangi Falls, Tolmer Falls or Florence Falls. (see page 42 details)

6. Crocosaurus Cove

Get up close and personal with the giant Saltwater crocodiles at Crocosaurus! Say hello to the Western Bearded Dragons and Olive Pythons. Hand feed crocodiles during feeding time or for thrill-seekers, experience the 'Cage of Death'; the only cage in the world that brings you face to face with some of the largest Saltwater crocodiles in captivity. 8. Camel Ride



Virgin Australia, Qantas and QantasLink fly from capital cities to Uluru (Ayers Rock) and Qantas and QantasLink to Alice Springs. Skywest regional airline provides flights from Darwin to Perth, Broome and Kununurra.

BY RAIL Take the ultimate journey through the heart of Australia on The Ghan. This amazing rail journey begins in Adelaide and traverses the Red Centre, passing through Alice Springs and Katherine before concluding in Darwin in the Top End (also operates in reverse).

BY CAR Take the time to explore and discover as you make your way through the Northern Territory by road. Whether it's getting there, or getting around, we recommend Avis Car hire. See page 56 for details or ask your travel agent about the great specials Avis has to offer.

We offer a selection of suggested driving itineraries, providing you with the freedom to see the Northern Territory at your own pace. Refer to the Self Drive Holidays starting on page 11 for more details.

Speed limits apply in all urban areas and highways of the Territory. Travellers should drive at a speed that suits the road, vehicle, weather conditions and their driving experience. Avoid driving after dark, as cattle and wildlife often congregate alongside outback highways at night. Be aware that rental car insurance is void for accidents after dark, outside of built-up areas.

Aboriginal Culture

Almost one quarter of the Northern Territory's population are Aboriginal people and approximately half of the Territory is Aboriginal-owned land. Family business and ceremonies are important for Aboriginal people and these matters take priority, which may alter scheduled tours or restrict access to sites with spiritual significance.

Fees and Permits

A national park entry fee applies for visitors to Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park and Kakadu National Park. Many tours do not include this fee so it is essential to purchase a national park ticket prior to commencing your touring. Tickets can be purchased from National Park Entry Stations. Driving over Aboriginal owned land and access into Arnhem Land is restricted. Visitors must apply for a permit from the Northern Land Council or alternatively choose a tour where operators have permission from the traditional owners to enter their land.

OUR LOCAL SECRETS

For a fine dining experience I would head to...

Hanuman Restaurant on Darwin's busy Mitchell Street, a menu of both Indian and Thai cuisine served in exquisite surroundings.

For an Outback Experience I would visit...

The Overlanders Steakhouse nestled among the MacDonnell Ranges in Alice Springs, serving up freshly baked damper, emu and kangaroo.

If I had a free day I would travel to...

Fannie Bay Gaol, a historic gaol located in Darwin's Fannie Bay. Visit the depths of the gallows, where in 1952 the last Northern Territory execution took place.

Swimming

The Northern Territory has many safe places to swim, including local nature reserves and in some national parks. Salt and freshwater crocodiles are found in most Top End billabongs and rivers, and are occasionally seen on remote beaches. This is generally sign-posted, but if you are unsure, don't swim. Beach swimming is not recommended from October to April due to marine stingers.
