Kakadu National Park

The most famous national park in the Top End, there's something extra special about World Heritage Listed Kakadu National Park. You will feel it when you see the spectacular Jim Jim and Twin Falls, and when you travel the impressive waterways of the scenic Yellow Water Billabong and the East Alligator River. Share your holiday with an incredible amount of wildlife. Get the binoculars out as you will have the chance to see more than a third of Australia's bird species and loads of Freshwater crocs. On top of that, there are more than 1,000 plant species and a quarter of our native freshwater fish species; the Barramundi tops the list for fishing.

On land, Kakadu's landscape is rugged and dramatic. Explore the ancient Aboriginal rock art of Nourlangie Rock and Ubirr. Then head out to nearby Jabiru and Cooida. A round of golf at Cooida Golf Club will see you tee off at Australia's only golf course in a national park.

A lucky few each year have the chance to explore the mysterious terrain of Arnhem Land. The Aboriginal owners preserve their fascinating culture through arts and crafts, stories and traditions. Gain access to their world. Keep an eye out for local art galleries to take home a piece of Australian culture.

Discover the natural beauty and cultural importance of areas such as Mount Borradaile, the wild coastlines of the Cobourg and Gove Peninsulas as well as the archipelago of Groote Eylandt, where you'll receive a warm welcome from the traditional owners. Highlight your stay in Arnhem Land with world class fishing, pristine beaches and rich indigenous culture. Whichever road you take, your venture into Arnhem Land will be an unforgettable experience.

Hawk Dreaming Wilderness Lodge is located at Cannon Hill, near Ubirr, in the heart of Kakadu National Park.

With special permission from the traditional owners, gain access to the Aboriginal land of Hawk Dreaming and discover an area rich in Aboriginal cultural sites, spectacular rock formations and rock art only ever seen by very few. Wildlife and birdlife abound, billabongs and wetlands are home to a variety of native species of fish, birds and crocodiles. The landscape of Hawk Dreaming offers some of the best views of spectacular rocks and wetlands you're likely to see anywhere in Kakadu National Park.

With a capacity limited to just 24 guests at one time, the Lodge provides an intimate and personalised experience. Each of the 12 tented cabins has been designed to offer a comfortable and private place to relax and enjoy the tranquillity of the remote wilderness. Each cabin features comfortable twin beds with fresh crisp linen, a bedside table, light, fan, small verandah, private en suite with a hot shower and flushing toilet. An outdoor spa is available for use for those wanting to soak their muscles at the end of the day.

Come evening time, delightful three course meals are prepared in the camp's kitchen and served in the dining room. After dinner, cherish the unique opportunity to relax around the campfire and absorb the night-time sounds of Kakadu. In the morning, prepare for the day over a hearty breakfast.

Ideally situated within easy access of scenic walks, cruises, fishing, Aboriginal cultural experiences at Warradjan Cultural Centre and the traditional art galleries of Ubirr and Nourlangie Rock. The property offers 48 rooms with their own terrace area, air-conditioning, satellite TV and an en suite bathroom with walk-in shower.

From the private airstrip take a charter plane for a spectacular bird's eye view of Kakadu National Park. Visit nearby rock art, head out on a bushwalk or spend the day fishing for the famous Barramundi.
