Kangaroo Island offers a holiday that can be full of excitement and adventure, or as relaxing as you choose. Drive and explore the island at your own leisure with the following suggested itinerary and stay in pre-booked accommodation.

Day 1: Adelaide to Kangaroo Island

Travel from Adelaide to Cape Jervis via coach then board the SeaLink ferry for a 45 minute journey to Penneshaw. Drive into Pennington Bay, a fantastic photo opportunity. Stop off at Clifford's Honey Farm for honey tasting and honey ice-cream. Continue to Seal Bay for a guided walk to view Australian sea lions in their natural environment (own expense). For the more adventurous, stop off at Little Sahara to try sand boarding or take a walk up the dune to experience the views from the top. Continue to Kelly Hill Caves Conservation Park and take a guided tour in the caves or try adventure caving (extra cost). This evening settle into your accommodation, choice of hotel.

Day 2: Kangaroo Island to Adelaide

Head to Flinders Chase National Park to visit Remarkable Rocks, historic Weirs Cove, the stalactite fringed Admirals Arch and the population of New Zealand fur seals. Time permitting continue on to Kingscote to call in on some of the local producers on the island, like Island Pure Sheep Dairy & Cheese Factory or drop by KI Spirits, which use local and native produce to flavour their boutique liqueurs. Take a walk along the coast or visit Emu Bay Lavender Farm to sample lavender ice-cream. Make your way to the Penneshaw Wharf to board the SeaLink ferry and coach transfer back to Adelaide. (B)

Day 1: Adelaide to Kangaroo Island

A scenic coach trip from Adelaide to Cape Jervis to board the SeaLink ferry to Kangaroo Island. First stop is Rob's Shearing to learn how to shear a sheep before continuing to Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Distillery. After lunch, visit Seal Bay for a guided walk to see Australian sea lions. Nearby are the white sand dunes of Little Sahara, where some fun is to be had on the sand boards. Continue to the overnight accommodation at stunning Vivonne Bay with free time for kayaking, boogie boarding, surfing, swimming and bush walking. After your BBQ dinner spot the local wildlife or relax on the deck with a glass of local wine. (LD)

Day 2: Kangaroo Island to Adelaide

After a hearty breakfast, head to Flinders Chase National Park. Arrive at Remarkable Rocks and marvel at the huge granite boulders. Enjoy the spectacular coast and seascapes; continue to Admirals Arch at Cape du Couedic to watch the resident New Zealand fur seals frolic in the ocean or sunbake on the rocks. After lunch visit stunning Pennington Bay before heading to Penneshaw for the ferry and coach transfer for Adelaide. Time permitting, also visit Prospect Hill, Ironstone Hill, north coast beaches (weather permitting). (BL)

Day 1: Adelaide to Kangaroo Island

Depart for a scenic coach trip through the south coast to Cape Jervis. There you will connect with SeaLink's ferry for the cruise to Kangaroo Island to meet your tour coach. First stop will be Clifford's Honey Farm. Travel on to Vivonne Bay Bistro located on a 260 hectare bush property, for a delicious two course lunch. After lunch visit Seal Bay and enjoy a guided beach walk with a National Park Ranger among a breeding colony of wild and rare Australian sea lions. Next visit the fascinating Birds of Prey free-flight demonstration. Travel to Kingscote to watch a pelican feeding demonstration followed by the transfer back to your overnight accommodation. (L)

Day 2: Kangaroo Island to Adelaide

Touring begins at Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Distillery, an interesting bush engineered eucalyptus distillery that makes the most of its environmental resources. Travel to the centre of Kangaroo Island to the Kangaroo Island Wildlife Park where you can feed kangaroos, have your photograph taken with a koala, and take a guided tour of this wildlife and bird park. Next, travel to Hanson Bay Sanctuary taking the time to look for Koalas nestled up in the eucalypts before a scrumptious two course lunch at Kangaroo Island Wilderness Retreat. After lunch travel to the western most part of the Island where Flinders Chase National Park is located. After a short stop at the Flinders Chase Visitor Centre you will be taken to the rugged southern coastline for a walk on Remarkable Rocks and Admirals Arch. Admirals Arch boardwalk takes you down a rugged cliff face to reveal this spectacular arch, a natural nursery and safe haven for playful New Zealand fur seals. (BL)

Enjoy a full day exploring the beauty of Innes National Park - the spectacular and wild coastline of Southern Yorke Peninsula with its soaring cliffs and magnificent views over Kangaroo Island. Head back to base through a landscape of absolute beauty where kangaroos, emus & Wedge Tailed eagles are prolific. (BLD)

Day 4: Wilpena Pound to Adelaide

Walk to Yourambulla Caves where Aboriginal people have left rock art depicting their ceremonies over thousands of years. Travel back along the Eastern side of the mountains with its spectacular Red Gum lined creeks to Melrose, the oldest town in the Flinders Ranges. Day 1: Adelaide to Kangaroo Island

Next stop is Admirals Arch at Cape Du Couedic to watch the resident fur seals. Journey on to Stokes Bay and take a walk to Ironstone Hill. Overnight at Adelaide. (BL)

Day 3: Adelaide to Grampians National Park

Journey through the Adelaide Hills across the mighty Murray River on the way into the Grampians National Park, a place of great significance for the local Indigenous people. Gain an insight into their local customs with a stop at the Brambuck Cultural Centre. In the afternoon explore the region with a hike to either McKenzie or Silverband Falls. Overnight at Halls Gap. (L)

Day 4: Grampians National Park via Great Ocean Road to Melbourne

Travel along the Great Ocean Road enjoying fantastic coastal views, explore Port Campbell National Park including a visit to London Bridge, Loch Ard Gorge and the iconic Twelve Apostles. Pass through the beach towns of Apollo Bay and Lorne before a short stop at Kennett River to do some koala spotting. Drive the last part of the Great Ocean Road, stopping at the famed Aussie surf location before heading into cosmopolitan Melbourne. (B)

Day 1: Adelaide to Flinders Ranges

Enjoy an optional wine tasting in the stunning Clare Valley and after lunch enjoy the expansive views of Flinders Ranges, as we weave our way towards Wilpena Pound, one of Australia's most magnificent natural features. Overnight in the Flinders Ranges. (LD)

Day 2: Flinders Ranges to William Creek via the Oodnadatta Track

Pass the mining town of Leigh Creek and, visit the gallery of outback eccentric Talc Alf at Lyndhurst and follow the historic route of the old Ghan Railway and the Overland Telegraph line. Stop in Marree for some lunch beside the old Ghan rail station and travel the renowned Oodnadatta track past Australia's largest salt lake, Lake Eyre. The last stop for the day is

William Creek, home to its famous pub and a population of about six! Tonight temporarily increase the population. Overnight camp in William Creek. (BLD)

Day 3: William Creek to Coober Pedy

Desert landscapes of red dunes, salt pans and gibber plains feature then pass through Anna Creek Station, the world's largest cattle station at almost 24 000 square kilometres. Today's first stop is Lake Cadibarrawirracanna - yes that is the longest lake name in the world. Continue on to Coober Pedy, the 'opal capital of the world'. We take a town tour and view an underground house, underground church and mine tour including an opal cutting demonstration. The afternoon is free for some more exploring or you can even try 'noodling' (fossicking) for opals. Overnight in Coober Pedy. (BLD)

Day 4: Coober Pedy to Erdunda

Visit an opal noodling spot to try your hand at fossicking for gemstones. Visit a Kangaroo Orphanage before heading out across the Moon Plain. Pass the Dingo Fence and view the Breakaways Scenic Reserve before arriving at your overnight campsite at Erdunda. (BLD)

Day 5: Erdunda to Kata Tjuta and Uluru

Head to Uluru (Ayers Rock) for lunch, before visiting Kata

Tjuta. Tonight sleep in a permanent tent or curl up in a swag (Aussie bedroll). Overnight at Uluru. (BLD)

Day 6: Simpson Desert to the Northern Territory

Head to Finke, a traditional Aboriginal community situated close to Lamberts Centre, the geographical centre of Australia. Spend the afternoon travelling into the heart of Central Australia for a bush camp. (BLD)

Day 7: Uluru An exciting morning travelling to Uluru where we walk around the base to introduce you to the traditional food and spirituality of this sacred land then wonder at the changing shades as you witness a sunset at the rock. (BLD)
