## MINIMUM AGE AND LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

The minimum age for drivers of vehicle groups X, A, B, C and D is 21 years. Drivers aged 21 to 24 years inclusive are required to pay a \$27.50 per day surcharge, which is payable directly to Avis at the time of rental. For all other vehicle groups, the minimum age for drivers is 25 years.

Drivers must hold an open licence and have held that licence for at least 12 months.

### VEHICLE TYPES

Vehicles in particular groups are subject to availability and may vary by location. A similar vehicle to those pictured may be substituted. Not all vehicle types are available at all locations. All vehicles include: air-conditioning, ABS, dual airbags and CD/MP3.



### Day 1: Adelaide to Grampians National Park

### Day 1: Adelaide to Parachilna Gorge

Start the day by following an isolated track through Anna Creek, the world's largest working cattle station. At Coober Pedy, the opal capital of the world, enjoy a tour of an underground mine. A highlight for some is visiting Josephine's Kangaroo Orphanage, where you can meet the rescued kangaroos and baby joeys. Tonight sleep like the locals do – underground, in bunkhouse accommodation. Leave early for the trip back to Adelaide. There are many opportunities to stop for photos and enjoy lunch on the foreshore of Port Augusta at the tip of the Spencer Gulf, before arriving into Adelaide. (BL)
